



We offer students a wide-ranging enrichment programme to develop their passions and interests as well as gain greater confidence and self-belief.

Our extra-curricular sessions include After-School Clubs, Lunchtime Clubs, and Year 11 Intervention Sessions. Most after school clubs run between 3.15pm and 4.15pm. Year 11 intervention runs until 4:30pm.

In addition, there are opportunities to enrich the curriculum with regular trips, visits and guest speakers across all subject areas.

Parents/carers will need to provide consent for their child/ren to attend after school clubs through the Arbor Parent App. You do not need to provide consent for lunch time clubs. 
Book Club - Wednesday Lunch Time

Chess club is a social meeting place where students come together through chess.




For students that don't know how to play, our student leaders will support and teach you the game; if you already know, you can come along for some competitive play.


Art and Textiles Club - Tuesday 3.15pm -4.15pm A2

Duke of Edinburgh Award



The Duke of Edinburgh Award scheme is open to students in years 9 & 10 through application (new applications November 2024)










Homework Club - Monday 3.15pm - 4.15pm



Warhammer - Tuesday 3.15pm-4.15pm

Warhammer is a miniature wargame in which players enact battles using miniature models of warriors and fighting vehicles. The playing area is a tabletop model of a battlefield, comprising models of buildings, hills, trees, and other terrain features. Each player takes turns moving their model warriors around the battlefield and fighting their opponent's warriors. These fights are resolved using dice and simple arithmetic.

The assembly and painting of the models is a major aspect of the hobby, and many customers of Games Workshop buy models simply to paint and display them. A player might spend weeks assembling and painting models before they have a playable army.

Starter packs for players wanting to take part in this activity can be provided for a limited number of students.
